The Christian Religion—Jesus Christ

Jesus Christ was a Jewish prophet and teacher who founded the Christian religion. He preached and taught in Palestine almost 2,000 years ago.


To Christians, Jesus is the 'Son of God', and to most of them he is divine. Divine means related to God. Christians believe that God sent him to earth to save mankind.

The Story of Jesus

Jesus was born shortly before the death of King Herod the Great in 4 BC. Herod was a ruler appointed by the Romans, who controlled Palestine. Jesus grew up in Nazareth with Mother Mary and Joseph. Joseph was a carpenter. As Jesus grew old, he joined his father's occupation. At the same time, he became very thoughtful. When he was about 30 years old, Jesus began his ministry. This won him followers, and also enemies. About AD 30, he was arrested in Jerusalem and then executed by crucifixion (nailed to the cross), which was a punishment for criminals at that time.

Jesus depicted as the good shepherd


What does the name Jesus Christ mean?

The name Jesus is the Greek version of a common Hebrew name Joshua, meaning Saviour. Christ is the title, which comes from a Greek word meaning Messiah, one appointed by God. Thus, Jesus Christ means the saviour appointed by God.

Birth and Early Years

The Gospel tells that Jesus was born miraculously. An angel appeared to Mary and told her that she would bear a son, who would be the 'Son of God' — the Messiah.

Shortly before Jesus was born, Joseph and Mary travelled to Bethlehem. As the town was crowded, they were forced to find shelter in a stable, and Jesus was born there. His cradle was a manger. Angels appeared to shepherds in

nearby fields and proclaimed the birth of the Messiah. The Wise Men followed a star to Bethlehem to find the King of the Jews.

King Herod heard of Jesus' birth, and he feared a rival. An angel appeared to Joseph in a dream and warned him that Herod wanted to harm the child. Joseph and Mary fled with their child to Egypt. Herod was so angry that he ordered killing of all the boys in Bethlehem two years old or younger. After Herod's death, Jesus, Mary and Joseph returned to Nazareth.

What are Gospels?

Gospels mean 'good news'. These stories of Jesus are told in four books called Gospels, written by his four disciples Mathew, Mark, Luke and John.

What was the Passover?


It was an important feast in Jerusalem. During the feast the whole city was filled with people, who came from all over Palestine to celebrate this grand festival.

Teachings of Jesus

As he grew up, he noticed that there was a wide gap between the rich and the poor in society. He preached about—



It was mainly the poorer sections who became his strong followers. They believed in his teachings and came to be called disciples of Jesus. He chose 12

disciples to help in his work. His early disciples were: Peter, Andrew, James the Elder and John.


The Gospels collect many of his teachings into long speeches or sermons and also through parables. Parables are short stories with a moral or religious principle.

Jesus thus formed his ministry. Jesus' miracles were also a part of his ministry. One such miracle tells us that he walked on the water of the Sea of Gallilee and stilled a storm. He fed thousands of people from a few fish and loaves of bread. But the most important of his miracles were the miracles of healing. He cured

lepers, blind persons, healed the lame and raised three people from the dead.

Arrest and Crucifixion

Jesus and his disciples went to Jerusalem to celebrate the Passover. Jesus entered the city in triumph, riding a donkey, an animal that is a symbol of being meek. People spread palm branches before him and welcomed him.

The Roman Emperor
Constantine converted to

Prior to this Jews who chose to
become Christians were tortured
by the Jews.

Jesus next went to the Temple and drove out people who were 'changing money and buying and selling'. He said that a Temple is a place for **prayer and worship** and not for **buying and selling**. This angered the Jewish religions leaders, and they began to *plot his death*. He gave **bread** to his disciples, saying, 'This is my blood.' Christians remember the Last Supper in their sacrament of communion.

The Last Supper


After the Supper, Jesus and his disciples went to the Garden of Gethsemane. He was taken to the Sanhedrin, the council looking into Jewish affairs. After condemning him for blasphemy, he was turned over to Pontius Pilate, the Roman Governor. Pilate attempted to free Jesus, as it was the custom to free one prisoner during Passover. But the crowd that had gathered outside his

palace demanded Jesus' death. Pilate then ordered him to be **executed** for claiming to be the *King of the Jews*.

What is blasphemy?

Speaking disrespectfully about God or sacred things.

The next day, a Friday, Jesus was crucified outside the city walls. He was forced to wear a crown of thorns and to carry his own cross to the site. Jesus was nailed to the cross until he died. This day in

the Christian calendar came to be known as Good Friday. Even when Jesus was nailed, his last words were: 'Father forgive them, for they know not

what they are doing.'

Resurrection

On the **Sunday**, following Jesus' death, his family members and his disciples went to his tomb and found it empty. An angel announced to them that *Jesus had been raised from the dead*. The Gospels tell stories of how Jesus appeared to his disciples in Jerusalem. He asked his disciples to go out into the world to tell his story and to spread his teachings. According to tradition, he *left the earth* and *ascended to heaven* after 40 days.

Thus, Jesus was resurrected and it proves that he was the 'Son of God'.
