The words a, an and the are called articles. We use them before nouns to indicate whether they are general or specific. A and an are called indefinite articles. Theis called the definite article.

Let us now study the use of articles.

We use a or an

- 1. when we are talking about something in general and not specific. For example,
 - I need a new phone.
 - I need an umbrella.
 - Mark wants a bicycle for his birthday.
- 2. when we are talking about something which is new, and are introducing it for the first time to the listener.
 - I have a bicycle.
 - I have bought a new dress.
- 3. before words that mean a collection of things. For example, a gallon, a dozen.

We use the

- 1. before nouns that are unique. For example,
 - The sun is bright today.

Note

- We use a before words that begin with a consonant sound and also before words that begin with a vowel but produce a consonant sound. For example, a river, a book, a European, a unicorn.
- We use an before words that begin with a vowel sound and also before words that begin with a silent h. For example, an ice cream, an umbrella, an hour.
