1. A map and A Globe.

A map

A Globe.

i) A map may represent the whole earth or just a part of it.

i) The globe represents the whole earth.

ii) It gives us two dimensional view of the Earth.

ii) It gives us three dimensional view of the Earth.

iii) Maps can be folded and handled easily.

iii) Globes are difficult to handle.

2. A map and A sketch.

A map

A sketch.

i) Maps are part or whole representation of the Earth.

i) Sketch is a drawing of a small area showing only some landmarks.

A map

i) Maps are drawn to scale.

ii) To express the various features on map, different colours, signs and symbols are used.

A sketch

i) Sketch are drawn without correct measurement.

ii) A sketch is drawn without any symbol.

8. A sketch and A Plan.

A sketch

i) A sketch is a drawing of a small area without correct measurement.

ii) It shows only some landmarks to locate a place.

A plan

i) A plan is also a drawing of a small area but with correct measurement.

ii) It shows all the details.

4. A Political and Physical map.

Political map

i) It shows international boundaries between countries; state and district boundaries within countries, cities.

ii) It is used to show territorial borders.

Physical map

i) It shows landforms and water bodies through the use of different colours.

ii) It is used to show geographical properties.
