- Q-1. George Washington was born in Virginia, United States of America, in 1732.
- Q-2. George Washington was elected the first President of the United States of America in 1789.
- Q-3. The name of George Washington's father was Augustine Washington.
- Q-4. Although not much is known about Washington's childhood, he spent most of his youth in Ferry Farm, a plantation on the Rappahannock river in Virginia.
- Q-5. No, Washington was not formally educated. However, at the age of 17, he became the surveyor on the Virginia frontier.
- Q-6. In 1753, France and Britain were fighting for control of a vast area known as the Ohio Territory.
- Q-7. In the late autumn of 1753, Washington volunteered to undertake a dangerous mission to deliver an ultimatum to the French to withdraw from that region.
- Q-8. Washington accompanied British Major General Edward Braddock on a mission to drive the French away from the Ohio valley.
- Q-9. When in a surprise attack, the French and Red Indian forces killed Braddock and most of his officers, then Washington rescued the remaining British forces.

d. 1755 - Washington accompanied British Major General Edward Braddock on a mission to drive French out from the Ohio Valley.

e. 1758 - Washington resigned from the army and returned to Mount Vernon and married a rich widow, Martha Custis.

f. 1793 - The first term of Washington's office as a President was completed.
