A good citizen


A good citizen is one who:

- respects the environment and does not cause any damage to it.



Fundamental Rights


We are citizens of our country because we were born here. The Constitution of India provides some basic rights to all its citizens. They are called the Fundamental Rights.

- · to preserve the forest, lakes, rivers and wildlife.




Importance of being a good citizen and a good neighbour Before being a good citizen tit is very important to Hello!
